Schools from across the diocese were similarly represented to participate in this event, the 175th anniversary of Catholic Mission around the world. Lead us to find peace, respect and freedom. Unite us in the making and sharing of tools of peace against ignorance, poverty, disease and oppression. Grant that we may grow in harmony and friendship as brothers and sisters created in Your image, to Your honour and praise. Amen.

Over the next few weeks, the students will be looking at ways they can support Catholic Mission and those less fortunate than ourselves.

Gospel Reflection

Gospel, Mark 10:35-45



James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached him. 'Master,' they said to him, 'We want you to do us a favour.' He said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your <u>right</u> hand and the other at your left in your glory.' But <u>Jesus</u> said to them, 'You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup that I shall drink, or be baptised with the <u>baptism</u> with which I shall be baptised?'

They replied, 'We can.' <u>Jesus</u> said to them, 'The cup that I shall drink you shall drink, and with the <u>baptism</u> with which I shall be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my <u>right</u> hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with <u>James</u> and John, so <u>Jesus</u> called them to him and said to them, 'You know that among the <u>gentiles</u> those they call their rulers <u>lord</u> it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. Among you this is not to happen. No anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all.

For the Son of man himself came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'

Sunday's Gospel of Mark is a discussion Jesus is having with his disciples. He responded to His disciples by saying that leadership isn't about power or making their authority felt. Leadership is about servant hood, even when it involves suffering and giving one's life. The only way to glory is by self-emptying and serving. Much of our doing for others is simply part of our everyday life; for example, the care parents take of children, couples doing thoughtful things for each other and colleagues cooperating with each other. Being a slave of all, as Jesus says, isn't always something extra or big; most of the time it is simply doing our everyday tasks and keeping in mind that others are the body of Christ. It is doing our everyday tasks with loving care.


Saint of the week St Luke

2016 Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials

Any Primary students enrolled in Year 5 and 6 in 2016 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term Four in 2015 and Term One in 2016.

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in Years 5 & 6 in 2016 be invited to attend.

Parramatta Diocesan trials will be held in the following sports:

*AFL (boys), Basketball (B&G), Cricket (B&G), Diving (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Football (B&G), Golf (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Netball (girls), Rugby League (11yrs & Opens), Rugby Union (boys), Softball (B&G), Tennis (B&G), & Touch(B&G).

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website <u>www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au</u>. This online form is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST** for the 2016 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. You may complete this form to attend a selection trial or if you have been selected in a representative squad or team. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and **MUST be approved by your child's school**. In order for your child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of your school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. **Please complete all fields and especially "Representative Experience"**.

Your child's school will notify you one week prior to the trial date if your child is to attend to the Parramatta Diocesan trial for their selected sport by providing a trial information sheet. Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

Currently only the Summer Sports of BASKETBALL, CRICKET, SOFTBALL & TENNIS are open and registrations close on Friday 30th October as these trials will be held in November 2015. All other sport registrations will open on 2nd November for 2016 trials.
