Last Sunday's Gospel was the story of the Road to Emmaus, where the disciples walking along the road, deep in conversation about the recent events of Jesus' death and resurrection, fail to recognise the stranger who joins them. This is also true for us. Many times we are so busy with our own affairs that we fail to recognise and remember Jesus who walks alongside us always. Our Formation Goal for this year is to further develop our awareness of Jesus' presence in our life and how we can make connections to the Christian Scriptures in the New Testament. Literacy Professional Learning:

This year our school's literacy goal is for all students to use richer vocabulary and develop skills and strategies to improve their spelling.

During the holidays, fifteen staff members attended a course presented by Misty Adoniou, a Senior Lecturer in Language Literacy and Teaching English as a Second Language at the University of Canberra. In her workshop, teachers looked closely at the linguistics of words and ways in which etymology (word origins), morphology (meaning components), phonology (sounds) and orthography (spelling conventions) provide strong, multiple pathways into learning words.

Staff will continue to engage in professional learning by unpacking Misty Adoniou's book, **Spelling It Out: How Words Work & How to Teach Them** during this year's staff meetings.





Last Friday, staff engaged in the professional development course, **Seven Steps to Writing Success.** This K-6 writing program aims to empower teachers to inspire our students to rapidly improve their writing skills and more importantly, learn to love writing. A wonderful day of learning for our staff.

From the classroom...3W and 2B


