
We wish all our dads, grandads and father figures in our lives a very happy Father's Day for this Sunday.

Gospel Reflection Sunday 3rd September 2017 (Matthew 16:21-27)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself.

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to <u>Jerusalem</u> and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord,' he said. 'This must not happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life?

'For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and, when he does, he will reward each one according to his behaviour.'

"What will it profit a man, if he gains the whole world and forfeits his life?" These words of Jesus changed many lives of many great people. There is a proverb that says, "To gain something we have to lose something." Sometimes we need to go without to have a better understanding of those less fortunate than ourselves. STEM - Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics

Stem is a fun group that helps us learn about all the different areas of science, technology, engineering and mathematics. We get set a lot of fun challenges to do in a certain amount of time. Like we have to make a balloon car in 60 minutes or bottle flip 3 different types of plastic bottles 15 times each and see how many times we can land it. So stem is a fun learning group which all of my group and I love and the best thing about it is that you don't know what to expect every time you go there so you don't know what you're doing. Mrs Lopresti has been a great and fun teacher who puts all of her spare time just to make this special club a good one. Not only do we get to do the experiment we also get to record how we did it and all the science and maths behind that simple task. In Mathematics we have learnt how to change fractions into percentages and work out the average (mean) of a variety of numbers. Every fortnight we do stem and then we swap with another group who does stem

STEM - By Eva and Leila

This term we have been doing activities in a club called Stem - Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. We get challenges second week based on science, technology, engineering and mathematics. In our first lesson for stem we did bottle flipping. We had to choose how much water we could put in the bottle and we could see how it works out. We had to measure with a ruler how much water we should put in. We put a quarter of the water in the bottle. We used three types of bottles to see which one works best. For us the small bottle was the best at flipping. The next fortnight we had to make a car that all four wheels had to move and it had to be air powered. We had to use a balloon to make it move. One of the problems was that we didn't have enough air to blow into the balloon so the balloon did not go very far. We have learnt about different forces in science and Newton's Laws of motion. Eventually we did get it to move at the end. For us stem is very, very fun!
