I would like to commend the students and the gains they have made in their learning in the first semester. It is always a pleasure to read the glowing reports.

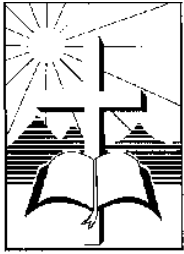

Gospel Reflection

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, Year A

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 6:51-58

Jesus said to the Jews:

'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.'

Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said. Jesus replied: 'I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you. Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him. As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live forever.'

Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This day was once called *Corpus Christi*, which is Latin for "Body of Christ."

The reading is part of a discussion between Jesus and a crowd of Jews. It comes shortly after the miracle of the loaves and fishes. Miracles are "signs" through which people come to believe that Jesus is the Son of God. These signs are followed by an explanation and discussion.

Jesus' words are not well understood by the crowd; they argue that Jesus is not from heaven but born of Mary and Joseph. The crowd also has trouble understanding how Jesus could give them his flesh to eat. Jesus tells them that when they eat his flesh and drink his blood, they will remain forever connected to him. These are difficult words, but they are important because they seek to show us our intimate connection with Jesus.

When we share in the Body and Blood of Christ, Jesus himself comes to dwell within us. This communion with the Lord makes us one body, brings us eternal life, and sends us forth to be Christ's Body in the world.

Talk to your children...

Our faith teaches us that when we gather to celebrate Mass, Jesus is present to us. The bread and wine truly become the Body and Blood of Christ. This is what we mean by the word transubstantiation: Jesus makes himself present to all who receive the Body and Blood of Christ.

Recall that every time we receive the Eucharist, Jesus keeps the promise he made in today's Gospel—those who eat his flesh and drink his blood will remain forever connected to him. Family members can share what it means for them to receive Jesus in the Eucharist.

5. crocodile wire (2)


Steps

- crocodile wire


Steps

1. Put 1.5V battery into cell holder.
2. Gently twist the bulb into light holder.
3. Connect one crocodile lead into the metal tab of cell holder.
4. Connect the other end of same crocodile lead to the metal tab of the lamp holder.
5. Connect the other crocodile lead to the other tab of the lamp holder.
6. Finally attach the last crocodile clip to the other end of the 1.5V cell holder.

- Two match box cars


Steps
