Dear Parents,

"The angel of the Lord declared unto Mary, 'Behold the handmaid of the Lord'. And the Word was made flesh."

Last week, I gave a brief account of the Mysterion – God's saving plan for His people of whom we are part. A pivotal part of this plan was when God sent His Son to become man. Every day at noon, we recall this significant event by praying the Angelus. This Tuesday is the Feast of the Annunciation, a celebration of when 'the word became flesh'. The school will hold a special liturgy to mark this feast day. This will be directly after morning break at 11.45am and finishing with the Angelus at noon. The community will gather near the Marian Reflection Space. We hope you can join us.

This week has been incredibly busy beginning on Monday with St Patrick's Day. This is traditionally a gold coin fun day with money raised going to Caritas Australia for Project Compassion. The amount raised was approximately \$680 supplemented by the parents who held a special lunchtime treat and gave the proceeds to this cause.



Quality Catholic Schools Survey

Last week, sixty parents received a letter inviting them to participate in the Quality Catholic Schools Survey. These parents were randomly selected by the Catholic Education Office and the names passed on to us. Gospel Reading Third Sunday of Lent, Year A

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 4:5-42 (Shorter form John 4:5-15, 19-26, 39-42)

Jesus came to the <u>Samaritan</u> town called Sychar, near the land that <u>Jacob</u> gave to his son Joseph. Jacob's well is there and Jesus, tired by the journey, sat straight down by the well. It was about the sixth hour. When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, 'Give me a drink.' His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, 'What? You are a Jew and you ask me, a Samaritan, for a drink?' - Jews, in fact, do not associate with Samaritans. Jesus replied: 'If you only knew what God is offering and who it is that is saying to you: Give me a

drink, you would have been the one to ask, and he would have given you living water.' 'You have no bucket, sir,' she answered 'and the well is deep: how could you get this living water? Are you a greater man than our father Jacob who gave us this well and drank from it himself with his sons and his cattle?' Jesus replied: 'Whoever drinks this water will get thirsty again: but anyone who drinks the water that I shall give will never be thirsty again: the water that I shall give will turn into a spring inside him, welling up to eternal life.' 'Sir,' said the woman, 'give me some of that water, so that I may never get thirsty and never have to come here again to draw water. I see you are a prophet, sir. Our fathers worshipped on this mountain, while you say that <u>Jerusalem</u> is the place where one ought to worship.' Jesus said: Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in <u>Jerusalem</u>. You worship what you do not know; we worship what we do know; for salvation comes from the Jews. But the hour will come - in fact it is here already - when true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth: that is the kind of worshipper the Father wants. God is spirit, and those who worship must worship in spirit and truth.' The woman said to him, 'I know that Messiah – that is, Christ – is coming; and when he comes he will tell us everything.' 'I who am speaking to you,' said Jesus 'I am he.' Many Samaritans of that town had believed in him on the strength of the woman's testimony, so, when the Samaritans came up to him, they begged him to stay with them. He stayed for two days, and when he spoke to them many more came to believe; and they said to the woman, 'Now we no longer believe because of what you told us; we have heard him ourselves and we know that he really is the saviour of the world.'

Lent is a season for repentance. It is a season during which we are called to reflect upon and to live deeply the promises of Baptism. The well and the conversation about water immediately recall for us the Sacrament of Baptism. The Samaritan woman was sent on a mission because of her interaction with Jesus. Jesus calls us in our own Baptism to spread the Good News to others – how well do we actually do this?

Take a moment to read this passage and listen to the way that Jesus speaks to the Samaritan women. She does not understand His true identity and as such, does not show him the respect he deserves. Even though Jews did not associate with Samaritan people, Jesus still speaks to the women with utmost respect. He is a true role model of treating all people with respect.

- This weekend at home... Talk about the Sacrament of Baptism with your family. You may have attended a Baptism recently or know of families within our community who have recently baptised their children. You might have a photo or a candle from the Baptism of someone in your family. Talk with your children about their Baptism - tell them a funny story about the day of their Baptism or simply explain to them what happened. Read over the Gospel from this Sunday with your children. It is important that you help them to realise that Jesus knew the woman's sin and forgave her. After her conversation with Jesus, she knows He is the Messiah and she tells everyone in her town about Jesus. Pray a prayer of blessing for each member of the family that God will help each one live the promises of his or her Baptism. Pray together the Lord's Prayer.

Information for Parents NRMA Science & Road Safety Day - Friday 4 April, 2014

The day is a great opportunity for your children to learn about road safety from a science perspective, so that they can better understand the forces that act on humans while in cars and on bikes and why wearing safety gear such as seatbelts and bike helmets make a real difference to their safety.
