On Monday I was invited into the Year 6 Learning Spaces to participate in a literacy activity in which the Year 6 children skyped a classroom in Japan. The students were able to link up and interact with the Japanese students and participate in an 'eye spy' quiz, in which clues were given about a famous Japanese or Australian landmark. It provided a wonderful opportunity for the Japanese students to practice their English by listening to Australian children's pronunciation and expressions.

The experience led me to reflect on the changing landscape of education, and how technology and new innovations have made schools and learning a very different experience to when I was at school. The fact that children in Rouse Hill could live stream and have a lesson with a school in Japan with a 2 hour time difference is amazing, and a wonderful opportunity for both the Japanese and our children to connect.

Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time Sunday, 18th November Gospel Reflection (Mk 13:24-32)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark *He shall gather his elect from the four winds.*

Jesus said to his disciples: 'In those days, after the time of distress, the sun will be darkened, the moon will lose its brightness, the stars will come falling from heaven and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory; then too he will send the angels to gather his chosen from the four winds, from the ends of the world to the ends of heaven. 'Take the fig tree as a parable: as soon as its twigs grow supple and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near. So with you, when you see these things happening: know that he is near, at the very gates. I tell you solemnly, before this generation has passed away all these things will have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. 'But as for that day or hour, nobody knows it, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son; no one but the Father.'

Reflection

There is often a lot of talk and frenzy about the end of the world coming. It especially happens with certain natural phenomenon such as comets, eclipses, and meteor showers. It's important to understand that Jesus insisted we cannot know the day or the hour, that we cannot predict when this will happen. Sometimes unusual events in the heavens are just natural phenomenon for us to enjoy, not to worry about. Do you worry about the end of the world? If so, why? If not, why not?

When you hear talk about predictions of the end of time, how do you feel? What do you say? What do you think about? Do you ever worry about dying? If so, why? If not, why not? Parents' Guide to helping children with reading at Home

You make a difference to your children's reading journey. Your role as an advocate for your children's reading success cannot be overestimated. It has a direct impact on the ease and confidence with which they pursue their reading and writing.

It is the joy and love of sharing a good book on a nightly basis that sets the foundation for their reading success and ensures that reading is given the priority it deserves. Reading regularly with someone who cares is the inspiration that all readers deserve.

As parents and carers, you create the home context for reading and set the tone for how reading is valued. Fear, anxiety, stress and humiliation have no place in the reading experience. The 'payoff' for reading together has to be worth coming back to night after night after night. When reading together is the best time of your children's day and the best time of your day, it is worth turning up. The right book infused with fun, laughter, and love goes a long way in creating life-long readers who in thirty years' time recall with joy being snuggled on the lounge with you and their favourite book.
