

Gospel Reflection

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 3:13-17

Jesus said to Nicodemus:

'No one has gone up to heaven except the one who came down from heaven, the Son of Man who is in heaven; and the Son of Man must be lifted up as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him. Yes, God loved the world so much that he

gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life. For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved.'

In John's Gospel, Jesus' death on the cross as well as his resurrection and return to the Father are one event. For him, the cross is a sign of exaltation. The eternal life God offers through Jesus is not life without end but life lived in the unending presence of God. Jesus is sent to this world as a gift. Only believers accept the gift. God's judgment on the world is not a future cosmic event but a present reality. God sent the Son out of love for the world. However, the world has to decide to accept him. Those who accept him have eternal life at the moment of the decision.

This Weekend with your Children...

Remind your children of how proud you are of them. Point out that often achievements and accomplishments are signified by the presentation of trophies, medals, ribbons, or certificates. Show some examples of such awards in your family's possession. Say, We have one other symbol in our home that celebrates a victory that we all can share in. Show a cross or crucifix that you keep on display in your home. Talk about what the word exaltation means—to raise high, to lift up, to sing praise to. Explain the significance of this feast day to your children.

Confirmation, a sacrament of initiation, establishes young adults as full-fledged members of the faith. This sacrament is called *Confirmation* because the faith given in Baptism is now confirmed and made strong. During your Baptism, the parents and Godparents promise to renounce Satan and believe in God and the Church on the child's behalf. At Confirmation, the candidate renews those same promises, this time speaking for themself.

During Confirmation, the focus is on the Holy Spirit, who confirmed the apostles on Pentecost and gave them courage to practice their faith. We, as Catholics, believe that the same Holy Spirit confirms Catholics during the Sacrament of Confirmation and gives them the same gifts. Traditionally, the seven *gifts* of the Holy Spirit are wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude (courage), knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. These gifts are supernatural graces given to the soul.

Over the next two Friday nights many of our OLA students are being confirmed. We pray for these students and their families. Thank you to the staff members who are attending to support the children.
