Dear Parents,

This week we welcome back Mrs Byrne, REC, from her pilgrimage to the Holy Land and Italy. I have asked her to feature her reflections.

My pilgrimage was one of deep faith and extremely spiritually. I was able to visit many places I had only heard about in the New Testament. It was not only amazing being present in these places but they took my breath away. I was extremely fortunate to go on this trip and feel blessed to have been in many places where Jesus had walked. We travelled to Bethlehem and saw the place where He was born and then to Jerusalem. Where I stood in the place where Jesus was crucified. Then I walked into His empty tomb.

I was extremely lucky to share this pilgrimage with other new principals, RECs and CEO staff. Our faith was guided and nurtured by Bishop Vincent, who challenged us to not be afraid to be the 'Face of God' and allow Jesus to be with us and work through us like the disciples. Not only did our pilgrimage take us to the sites in the Holy Land, we were also able to see and hear many stories of people who are courageous and put the needs of others before themselves to make a difference. These people reach out daily to those who need assistance and have been outcasts by society. We listened to the struggles different cultures face to make a difference and to move beyond anger and discrimination and to try to find peace. We visited a school where many

students had no other school to go to, due to their needs and to see the smiles on their faces when we visited, made the visit worthwhile.

This experience not only deepened my faith but it left me with a sense of what servant leadership is and how I can follow in the mission of Jesus and

Assisi was an extremely beautiful, calm and prayerful place where we were able to reflect on our journey, the places we visited and how we have gained the courage to continue the journey of discipleship on our return. Gospel Reflection (Jn 14:1-12)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John
I am the way, the truth, and the life.

Jesus said to his disciples:

'Do not let your hearts be troubled.
Trust in God still, and trust in me.
There are many rooms in my Father's house;
if there were not, I should have told you.
I am now going to prepare a place for you,
and after I have gone and prepared you a place,
I shall return to take you with me;
so that where I am
you may be too.
You know the way to the place where I am going.'

Thomas said, 'Lord, we do not know where you are going, so how can we know the way?' Jesus said:

'I am the Way, the Truth and the Life.
No one can come to the Father except through me.
If you know me, you know my Father too.
From this moment you know him and have seen him.'

Philip said, 'Lord, let us see the Father and then we shall be satisfied.' 'Have I been with you all this time, Philip,' said Jesus to him 'and you still do not know me?

that I am in the Father and the Father is in me?
The words I say to you I do not speak as from myself:
it is the Father, living in me, who is doing this work.
You must believe me when I say

reason.

'I tell you most solemnly,

will perform the same works as I do myself,
he will perform even greater works,
because I am going to the Father.'

- What about me? managing your own anxieties

Application for Extended Leave – Travel for 5 days or more

The government has amended its criteria for an extended leave application. If your child is going to be away from school for 5 days or more, you are now required to complete an Application for Extended Leave Form. We have attached this form to the newsletter and it is also on the website. You must attach flight details if you are going overseas or flying interstate.

REMINDER.... Official school hours for supervision start at 8.20am and finish at 3.40pm. Leaving children before this time means they are unsupervised. Many children are being dropped as early as 8am. This is unfair and unsafe. For this reason, I have asked any children at school early to sit quietly and pray in the church and wait until the gates open.

Lately I have noticed some of the children gathered and sitting on the sidewalk and kerb outside on Wellgate Ave. I have concerns about their safety here. PLEASE, if you need to drop your child before the gates open, OOSH is available. At the very least, speak to them about the expectation of waiting *quietly* in the church. Either way, there is no supervision by the school before 8.20am.

I thank you for your understanding and cooperation in the interest of your child's safety.
