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

GOSPEL (John 6:24-35)

When the crowd saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they themselves got into boats and came to Capernaum looking for Jesus. And when they found him across the sea they said to him, "Rabbi, when did you get here?" Jesus answered them and said, "Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled. Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him the Father, God, has set his seal." So they said to him, "What can we do to accomplish the works of God?" Jesus answered and said to them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent." So they said to him, "What sign can you do, that we may see and believe in you? What can you do?" Our ancestors ate manna in the desert, as it is written:

'He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'

So Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."

So they said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always." Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."

Reflection

Even though the crowd in today's gospel had enough faith in Jesus—they got into their boats and went looking for him, still they had the small doubt in who He was. The crowd wanted another sign so they might truly believe in him. Jesus tells the crowd that the sign is in their midst, and has always been in their midst. For it was God who gave the bread from heaven to their ancestors in the desert, and it is God who gave them the true bread from heaven, Jesus himself the bread of life.

A familiar phrase used by children and adults alike is, "Prove it to me." In a sense, this is what the followers of Jesus are saying to him on Sunday's Gospel, "Prove it to us, Jesus. Give us a sign so that we might believe in you." Every day we see signs of God; He is in our hearts and listens to us when we talk to Him. We just need to open our eyes and our hearts to the signs of God's presence.

The Feast of Our Lady of Angels

August 2: Our Lady of Angels, Assisi, Italy (13th Century)

Our Lady of Angels, or have the Portiuncula, is located six hundred yards from the city of Assissium, in Italy. It was a desolate locality, and apparently an unsettled one where robbers and the lawlessness flourished, for the Benedictines who had lived at the monastery felt it was too hazardous to remain there. They abandoned the monastery, relocating to Mount Subasio, which was a fortified monastery.

The original chapel is thought to date from the 4th Century, and was built by holy hermits who had come from the Valley of Josepha. It is said that they brought relics of the Blessed Virgin with them to the region when they constructed the chapel.

When Saint Francis chanced to come upon the little, run down and abandoned chapel of Our Lady of Angels, or Santa Maria degli Angelis, in the year 1208, it was almost completely hidden in shrubs and brush. Saint Francis entered the hidden church, which measured only twenty-two feet by thirteen feet, and saw the ancient fresco that had been placed above the main altar. It was an image of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin surrounded by angels. Some say that this is why the chapel was named Our Lady of Angels, although there are also legends that angels could often be heard singing there.

Immaculate Virgin, Mother of Jesus and our Mother,
We believe in your triumphant assumption onto Heaven
Where the angels and saints acclaim you as Queen.
We join them in praising you and bless the Lord
Who raised you above all creatures.
With them we offer you our devotion and love.
We are confident that you watch over our
daily efforts and needs, and we take comfort
from our faith, in the coming resurrection.
We look to you, our life, our sweetness, and our hope.
After this earthly life, show us Jesus,
The blest fruit of your womb,
O kind, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

Save the Date – Grandparents Day


This year we will celebrate Grandparents' Day on Monday 24th August with Mass, morning tea and a mini concert. Please let grandparents know to keep this date free.

Firstly, the blue crayon should take a break because he is so tiny. IF he doesn't take a break he will be gone forever.


