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

Dear Parents,



Today was **Walk to School Day**. What a wonderful sight it was to see so many families walking together and talking. Something that was the norm some years back has been given away through *busyness*. So many menial tasks – washing clothes and hanging, washing and drying dishes to name a few – were the forum for family conversations. Despite the arrival of many labour saving devices, somehow all the ‘extra time’ hasn’t always been put to



family time.

Pope Francis, who is particularly interested in the role of the family, has called an Extraordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops on the theme “The Pastoral Challenges of the Family in the Context of Evangelization”. The synod, will take place at the Vatican 5-19 October, 2014

In an address during World Youth Day in Brazil,

On Saturday, July 27, [Interview on Radio Cathedral](#) (radio broadcasting station of the Archdiocese of Rio de Janeiro, Pope Francis said, “*Not only would I say that the family is important for the evangelization of the new world. The family is important, and it is necessary for the survival of humanity. Without the family, the cultural survival of the human race would be at risk. The family, whether we like it or not, is the foundation.*”

Francis has written a letter asking for prayers’ for the success of the Synod. In his letter, he writes:

‘I am writing this letter to you on the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. The evangelist Luke tells us that the Blessed Mother and Saint Joseph, in keeping with the Law of Moses, took the Baby Jesus to the temple to offer him to the Lord, and that an elderly man and woman, Simeon and Anna, moved by the Holy Spirit, went to meet them and acknowledged Jesus as the Messiah (cf. Lk 2:22-38). Simeon took him in his arms and thanked God that he had finally “seen” salvation. Anna, despite her advanced age, found new vigour and began to speak to everyone about the Baby. It is a beautiful image: two young parents and two elderly people, brought together by Jesus. He is the one who brings together and unites generations! He is the inexhaustible font of that love which overcomes every occasion of self-absorption, solitude, and sadness. In your journey as a family, you share so many beautiful moments: meals, rest, housework, leisure, prayer, trips and pilgrimages, and times of mutual support...

Nevertheless, if there is no love then there is no joy, and authentic love comes to us from Jesus. He offers us his word, which illuminates our path; he gives us the Bread of life which sustains us on our journey’



Sixth Sunday of Easter, Year A

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 14:15-21

Jesus said to his disciples: 'If you love me you will keep my commandments. I shall ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you for ever, that Spirit of truth whom the world can never receive since it neither sees nor knows him; but you know him, because he is with you, he is in you. I will not leave you orphans; I will come back to you. In a short time the world will no longer see me; but you will see me, because I live and you will live.

On that day you will understand that I am in my Father and you in me and I in you. Anybody who receives my commandments and keeps them will be one who loves me; and anybody who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I shall love him and show myself to him.'

In the Gospel this Sunday Jesus offers encouragement to his disciples, who will soon see him crucified. He reassures them that even though he will leave them, he will not abandon them. Instead he will send them the Holy Spirit, through whom the disciples will continue to live in union with Jesus. He explains that the gift of the Holy Spirit is permanent and the he will return to the Father, but the Holy Spirit will remain with the disciples forever. The mystery of the Trinity can be difficult for us to grasp. Today's Gospel invites us to consider how the three persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. They work together so that God's salvation is made known to us. Jesus' mission is continued through the activity of the Holy Spirit in the lives of his disciples. We have received this same Spirit through our Baptisms. The Spirit, living and working within us, reveals the mystery of God's love for us. Japanese Students –

THANK YOU TO THE FAMILIES WHO HAVE ALREADY RESPONDED. WE STILL NEED THREE FAMILIES TO HOST STUDENTS. IF YOU HAVE A SPACE TO HOST TWO STUDENTS, DO NOT MISS THIS VALUABLE OPPORTUNITY FOR THIS RICH EXPERIENCE FOR YOUR FAMILY.

As part of the Asian Studies Program, OLA has been fortunate to secure a grant to support the teaching of Japanese language and culture since the beginning. Last year this program was supported and enriched with the hosting of Japanese students. These students, aged 10-12 years old, were billeted by OLA families and spent the days at school. This was so successful last year that the school has again requested to visit and there are many more students excited to spend time at OLA, and an Australian school. There are 31 children in total with 23 girls and 8 boys to be hosted in twos with one group of three girls. The details are:

Dates: 23 July (Wed) until 29 July (Tue) for 6 nights

Host families will be paid \$40 per night per child and will provide 3 meals a day and return transfer to/from school.

The guests will spend the day in class with their host 'brother/sister'. The weekend is spent with the host family. However, on the Sunday, the guests are to be dropped at OLA school where they will travel with their group to their church in Marsfield. They will need to be collected at 4pm from OLA school.

These students are from Nanzan Christian School located in Nagoya, Japan. They are very well behaved students from good families. If you think you have the room to host, please send an email to the school office ola@parra.catholic.edu.au (NOT hgoldsworthy) with 'Japanese' in the subject line and your child's name and grade in the body of the email. First come first served. Thank you.

We hosted Japanese students last year and it was a fabulous experience for the whole family. We still keep in touch and are planning to visit them in Japan as soon as we can! I'll be having them again this year!

Year 4 iLearn Update

What fun we have been having in Year 4 as we continue our journey of using our iPads in the classroom as a learning tool. The students have loved creating iMovie trailers about experiences they have shared with their peers such as a reflection on Athletics, a learning journey as a group designed a veggie garden and the amazing time some students shared at the recent Zone Cross Country just to share a few.

The students have collaboratively worked on a shared document to create a story for David Wiesner's picture book Tuesday. This picture book has only a small handful of words to set the scene. Students shared a Google doc and worked cooperatively to create words for the story. Below are a few examples of the work we created.

We have used our iPads as assessment tools to show our understanding in Religion and Health. Some of the things we have shown is our understanding of the scripture passages Jesus heals a man born blind and the Journey to Emmaus. Also we have created safety presentations on how to stay safe on the road and as a pedestrian.

Our teachers always want feedback about things that happen in Year 4. The way we have shared our thought about tasks and how we can help improve our learning is through forms with specific questions, surveys, using the six thinking hats and a learning journey through a series of questions daily over the period of a task.

Here are some of our thoughts about having iPads in Year 4.

Tuesday- By Madison, Alexandra and Elouise

On Tuesday on a dark, peaceful night around eight pm it was very calm and still and everything was perfect until the lily pads started floating in the air carrying the Frogs on them. 


Subitising Flash Cards
