Sunday March 29 2015

On Palm Sunday Catholics celebrate the triumphal entry of Jesus Christ into Jerusalem, the week before his death and resurrection. Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week, which concludes on Easter Sunday. The Bible reveals that when Jesus entered Jerusalem, the crowds greeted him by waving palm branches and covering his path with palm branched. Immediately following this great time of celebration in the ministry of Jesus, he begins his journey to the cross.

Gospel Reflection Mark 14:1—15:47

Jesus is sentenced to death and crucified. The centurion who witnessed his death declared, "This man was the Son of God."

This Sunday, called Palm or Passion Sunday, is the first day of Holy Week. Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday are called the *Triduum*—three days that are the highlight of the Church year. There are two Gospels proclaimed at today's Mass. The first Gospel, proclaimed before the procession with palms, tells of Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem.

Riding on a borrowed colt, Jesus was hailed by the crowds as they blessed God and shouted "Hosanna!" This event is reported in each of the four Gospels.

At the Liturgy of the Word on Palm Sunday, the events of Jesus' passion are proclaimed in their entirety. In Lectionary Cycle B, we read the passion of Jesus as found in the Gospel of Mark. We will hear these events proclaimed again when we celebrate the Triduum later in the week. On Good Friday, we will read the passion of Jesus from the Gospel of John.

HOLY WEEK- Stations of the Cross

On Monday 30th March OLA will be celebrating Holy Week with Stations of the Cross. Students from St. John Paul II will be leading us in a reflection at 12:30 under the COLA. All parents and grandparents are welcome to join us in this liturgy.

Trafficking of persons is a human rights violation. Between 800,000 to 2 million persons are trafficked globally every year - 80% are women.


Human trafficking is the third largest source of income globally and the average cost of a slave today is US\$90. Australia is a country of destination.

Men, women and children are brought into Australia under false pretences and end up in forced labour. They are not free to leave because of fear of threat or harm to them and/or their families.

Many of the chocolate products sold over this Easter have been made by slave labour. On the right is the symbol to look for when purchasing a product that is guaranteed no child labour has been used in their production. (Aldi Easter chocolates have this symbol). This is one small way we can take a stand against this deplorable practice.

DID YOU KNOW????


DID YOU KNOW? On average, it costs around \$13,000 per year to educate a child in a NSW school. In most Catholic schools, school fees cover less than a quarter of this cost. The rest comes from taxpayers like you! This is why funding support from Federal and State Governments must keep pace with rising education costs - to maintain education quality and to ensure a Catholic education remains affordable for all families.

DID YOU KNOW? The Federal Government contributes 57.5% of the cost of educating a child in a NSW Catholic school, and the NSW Government contributes 19.7%. The remaining 22.8% comes from parents and the parish community through school fees and private fundraising. This is why funding support from Federal and State Governments must keep pace with rising education costs - to maintain education quality and to ensure a Catholic education remains affordable for all families.


DID YOU KNOW? According to the most recent figures available (2012), the average net cost of educating a student in a NSW Catholic school was \$11,532 per year. This is less than the cost of educating a student in a government school (\$12,118) or in an independent, non-government school (\$16,654). Catholic schools still rely on Federal and State Governments for more than 75% of our funding needs. This is why funding support from Federal and State Governments must keep pace with rising education costs - to maintain education quality and to ensure a Catholic education remains affordable for all families.




FROM THE CLASSSROOM... Year 2G
