1030am: Year 2



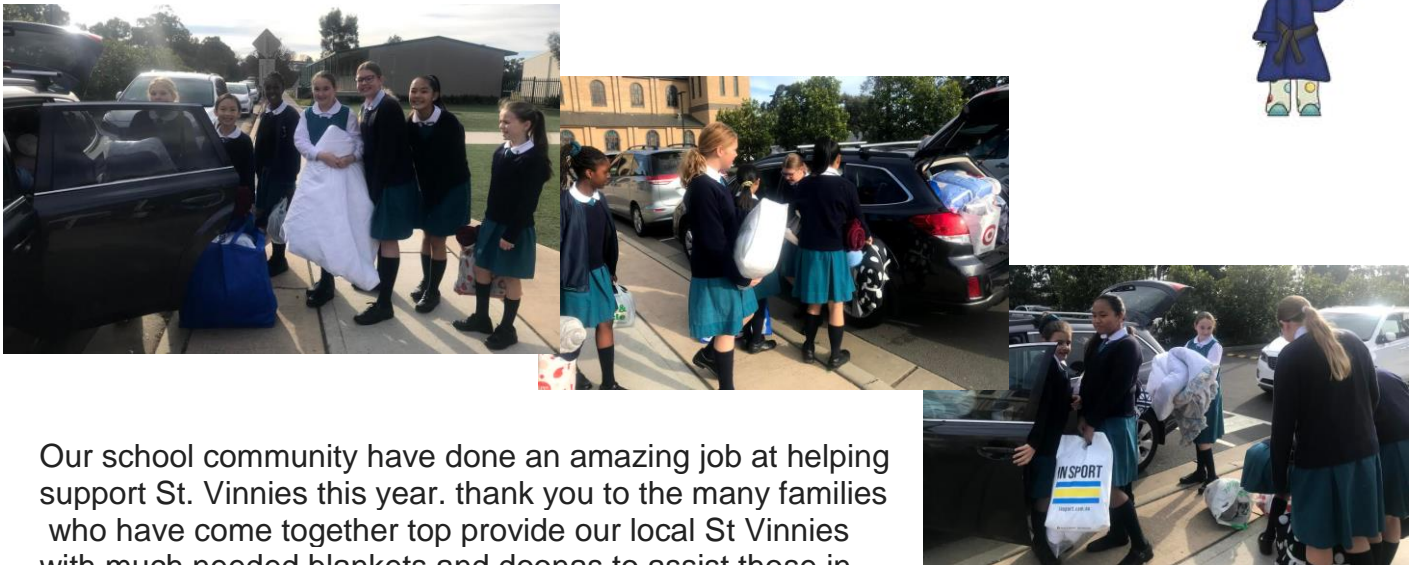
These will be in the grade learning spaces and spaced so that there is enough time those who have a number of grandchildren among the students to attend.

Literacy News

Holiday Tips for Parents-Avoiding the Holiday Slide in Reading

Many children, especially struggling readers, forget some of what they've learned or slip out of practice during the holidays. Try these strategies to help your child improve their reading during the break and beyond:

1. **Six books to success:** Research shows that reading just six books during the holidays may keep a struggling reader from regressing. When choosing the six, be sure that they are just right — not too hard and not too easy. Take advantage of your local library. Ask for help selecting books that match your child's age, interests, and abilities. Libraries often run reading programs that motivate kids to read, so find out what's available in your area.
2. **Read something every day:** Encourage your child to take advantage of every opportunity to read. Find them throughout the day:
 - *Morning:* The newspaper — even if it is just the comics or today's weather.
 - *Daytime:* Schedules, TV guides, magazines, online resources, etc. For example, if your daughter likes the food channel, help her look for a recipe on the network's Web site — then cook it together for more reading practice.
 - *Evening:* End the day by having your child read to you from the book he is currently reading (one of the six books, above). Have them rehearse a paragraph, page, or chapter before reading to you. Rereading will help them be more fluent — able to read at an appropriate speed, correctly, and with nice expression.
3. **Keep reading aloud:** Reading aloud benefits all children and teens, especially those who struggle. One benefit is that you can read books your child can't, so they will build listening comprehension skills with grade-level and above books. This will increase their knowledge and expand their experience with text, so that they will do better when they read on their own.

It's hard to keep up a reading routine in a season packed with distractions and diversions. These suggestions will fit into a busy schedule and make reading fun!

Exemption Forms

Please remember that an Application for Exemption Form **MUST** be completed at least three weeks prior to your child being away from school for five days or more.

This government requirement has now been in place for a few years and we are still getting parents advising us a day or two (or even the day of) before they leave for a vacation.

If the certificate is not issued prior to you leaving, then your child's roll will be marked as an 'unexplained absence'. A note after the event does not suffice in this instance because the leave has to be approved by the principal prior to the holiday.

Absence Notes

This year we seem to have a lot of unexplained absences on our rolls because notes for sickness etc have not been sent in on your child's return.

If your child has been away can you please make sure you send notification by either Skoolbag App, email or handwritten note so the roll can be marked correctly. If your child's teacher sends home a note regarding absences, can you please complete it and return as soon as possible.

Canteen update!

The canteen has been very popular and, overall, providing excellent service for the community. As with anything new, there is a transition stage and is regularly reviewed. I have met with the 'team' and shared the concern over the amount of lollies bought and consumed. From next term, sweets will only be on sale at second break on Fridays – Sweet Treat Fridays – aligning with the Friday special treats of the past. Students will also be limited to the purchase of one sweet item of a kind in any one transaction. Yes, they could get back on the line to buy again. However, the lines are generally so long that time will be up by then. Just a further note, there is not a time that I speak to the canteen crew without them marvelling at what beautifully polite students we have at OLA. We certainly accept the compliment and credit, but it mostly goes to you, their parents.

Well done. 😊

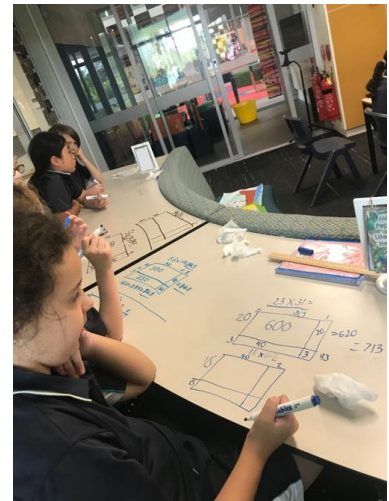

Afternoon Dismissal Procedure

In the afternoon our students are taken to two locations for dismissal.

Kinder students are collected from the Kinder COLA between 3pm and 3.10pm.

- Students who are collected through 'Kiss and ride' are taken to the Kinder COLA and library verandah.
- All students in years 1 - 6, who are collected by parents on site or who walk or catch the bus home, are taken to the 'Undercover' basketball court.

It would assist us if parents wait in the relevant area for your child. We are trying to minimise congestion around classrooms.

Only kinder parents should drive into the 'drive through' prior to 3pm. If you are collecting students in years 1 to 6, it might be more convenient to queue up down Wellgate Ave alongside the netball courts. This way you can turn left into the school grounds after 3.05pm.

We have had issues with trades people and parish visitors being unable to enter the grounds as the driveway is blocked with cars queuing for pick up. If you are entering to park your car, you are then able to do so.
