Ash Wednesday Mass

This coming Wednesday is Ash Wednesday which marks the beginning of Lent. During this Liturgical season of the Church, children and adults may sometimes ask the question: "What is Ash Wednesday?" The ashes used are made by burning the remains of the palms blessed on the Palm Sunday of the previous year. Ashes are an ancient symbol of repentance (sackcloth and ashes). They also remind us of our conversion of our lives during this season of renewal. During Lent, the Church asks us to contemplate ongoing conversion. To achieve conversion, the Church proposes the practice of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

It is the focal point of the church's liturgical year. It occurs forty days before Good Friday. We are reminded to be faithful to the Gospels. Believing in the Gospels helps us to walk with Jesus. We can be guided along this journey by such Gospel values as Love, Hope, Trust, Service, Forgiveness, Peace, Respect, Acceptance, Compassion and Justice.

We hope you can join us for Ash Wednesday Mass at 9.00am.

Literacy News

This year our school's learning goal is: All students will demonstrate growth in comprehension with a specific focus on SURFACE, DEEP AND TRANSFER learning across all KLAs.

Ways to improve reading comprehension at home Reread to build fluency. To gain meaning from text and encourage reading comprehension, your child needs to read quickly and smoothly — a skill known as fluency. By the beginning of Year 3, for example, your child should be able to read 90 words a minute.

Rereading familiar, simple books gives your child practice at decoding words quickly, so they'll become more fluent in their reading comprehension. **Repeating, Reviewing, and Remembering**

The more we engage with a story, the more we take away from it. That is often why, as adults, we choose to reread those classics we were assigned to read as students in school. We're sure to get more out of the book that second or third time we read it.

Similarly, when kids listen to the same story multiple times, they pick up new information, dive deeper into the meaning of the book, and make connections between themselves and the book — as well as between the book and other books they've heard.

Matific

A common question that is asked by parents is 'How can I help my children at home with Numeracy?' Numeracy today is taught differently to the way that it was taught in the past, therefore making parents feel that they can not help their children at home.

To support learning at home our school has previously used 'Mathletics' - an online resource that enables the children to engage in maths concepts in an interactive environment. In 2020 we are using a different online resource called 'Matific'. Teachers will be assigning tasks for students to complete at home. These tasks will be purposeful tasks to support the learning that is happening in the classroom. The tasks are designed in such a way that enable the children to engage at various levels according to their needs. The resource fee for 'Matific' has been included in your resource fee structure.

REMINDER:

Acceptable Hair Styles for Boys.
