Mt 15:21-28

Gospel Reflection

The overarching theme derived from today's readings is the question of insider-outsider. We see here that the divisions and barriers that emerge out of human experience have been shattered by the graciousness of God. Jesus' openness to 'the other' finds a precedent in the prophetic tradition. Isaiah spoke of a time when outsiders would join insiders in worshipping God, thus dissolving the categories of insider and outsider. He was, of course, referring to the age of eschatological fulfilment. This age dawned with the coming of Jesus. Jesus himself moved out of the constraints of his own cultural worldview, and he directs us to do the same. People are either excluded because of gender, culture, or religious perspective or included only because they are able and willing to conform to discriminatory standards. In the reign of God, this should not be the case. People are accepted along with their own cultural profiles.

God's embrace first enclosed even those who rejected Jesus, and then God's plan of salvation unfolded in a new way. An invitation to enter the kingdom was issued to the Gentiles, those who had been considered outsiders. If outsiders are now insiders, what has happened to the former insiders? Paul insists that they are still insiders. God has not simply shifted the identifying boundaries; God has dissolved them. In the interim between the dawning of the eschatological age and the end of time, the invitation to be included remains open to all.

Volunteers Needed

Morning Drop Off

We have noticed that there has been an increase in the number of students being dropped off before 8.20am. Please try to avoid dropping your children off before 8.20am as the children are unsupervised. If this is unavoidable, please speak to your children about the expectations that they are to sit next to the school gate and not play, especially with balls.

Birthday Treats

In regard to birthday treats that are sometimes sent in, we kindly ask that you refrain from sending anything in during this COVID 19 period. This is to ensure that children are only eating food that is supplied and/or prepared by you at home.

At this current time, we also kindly ask that you do not send in non-edible items as birthday treats eg, pencils etc due to COVID 19 as it is always unknown as to who has handled the items from manufacturer to classroom. This restriction is aimed solely at doing everything we can to ensure the safety of your child.

Values Matter at OLA

What are values? *Ideals that guide our behaviour*. They are ideals and beliefs we hold as special. Caring for others, for example, is a value; so is the freedom to express our opinions. Values are what people think is right and wrong, good and bad, desirable and undesirable.

This week we are focussing on the value of: **Fair Go** – pursue and protect the common good where all people are treated fairly – for a just society.

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled." Mt5:6

In this beatitude Jesus invites us to be passionate about the promotion of justice, not just thinking that the concept of justice is a good idea. Justice people are action people. This value includes the following characteristics:

- Respecting authority. Do you teach by example?
- Being involved in your community. What do you do as a family/individuals to show you 'care'?
- Does your child belong to a community group that is involved in helping others? As a family, do you provide for people less fortunate than yourselves? Eq, St Vincent de Paul.
- Accepting other people and their backgrounds
- Being tolerant and understanding of difference which includes religious, physical, family or personality differences.

The overall message:-

Being committed to the principles of social justice, opposing prejudice, dishonesty and injustice.

Theme for the Week "Fair Go"

Our theme this week is another of the 9 values for Australian Schooling. It focuses on treating others fairly and allowing others to participate; promoting justice, acceptance and tolerance. This value helps our society live in harmony and to foster relationships.
