Sunday 31st May Gospel Reflection Year A PENTECOST SUNDAY John 20:19-23

GOSPEL REFLECTION-Come Holy Spirit

Pentecost is called the birthday of the church because before Pentecost, there really was no church. Jesus had ascended back into the heavens, the Apostles were hanging around, scared and confused, and nobody knew what to do. Going out to baptise people and preach about Jesus was the last

thing they had in mind because their lives would be in danger.



But Pentecost celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit – the force that turned a bunch of frightened, mixed-up folks into church. There was a rush of wind, tongues of fire, and then suddenly there was courage, knowledge,

direction and commitment! Everyone started speaking and was understood, no matter what the language of the listener was! These were saints suddenly on fire with the Holy Spirit. And it all began with the wind and fire of the Spirit. What changes in you do you wish the Spirit could blow your way? How can you cooperate with the Spirit? In what ways do you need more courage, knowledge, direction or commitment? What else might you need?

In what ways are you and your parish like the disciples before Pentecost? In what ways are you and your parish like the disciples after Pentecost?

WORKING TOGETHER TO KEEP OUR OLA COMMUNITY SAFE

Please note a significant change that we ask for your support in is that we would like to limit the number of parents/adults within our school grounds. This will adhere to social distancing rules for adults and in turn minimise any potential risk.

We would envisage that students are able to independently enter through the gates and venture to their classrooms. We encourage you to use the drive through for pickup and drop off. If you normally collect your child in person from the COLA, we now ask you to please wait outside the gates near the Statue of Mary (keeping social distancing in mind) and we will deliver the students to you. As kindergarten leave a little earlier, they may wait outside the main gate next to the office.

We also continue to ask that contact with the teachers is via email (to the school) or phone only as there will currently be no face to face meetings.

Afternoon Drive Through

Our afternoon drive through car pick up has been very busy of late due to a number of factors, namely everyone is wanting to drive due to the current climate, and the fact that we have three major schools all in the same area.

We are not alone. All schools face similar challenges, although we are very blessed to have grounds that facilitate a drive through.

Your patience is very much appreciated.

Yes it is slow (to start).

Yes it takes time, but it is the safety of your children that is the priority.

Yes it is congested. (The phasing of the lights does not help as cars back up).

Yes the queue is long, as we have over 300 children using the drive through.

There are many options that you may also wish to investigate in relation to picking up your child:

- 1. Park at the oval and walk across the lights, collect your child and walk back. (This will be much quicker than the queue).
- 2. Park in surrounding streets and walk.
- 3. Walk and enjoy the exercise if close to school.
- 4. Come a little later rather than the "peak hour", ie. Drive through operates from 3.10pm until 3.40pm

We kindly ask that parents <u>do not</u> arrive before 2.50pm as Santa Sophia parents use the drive through between 2.40pm – 2.50pm.

Further important points to note:

- Please drive to the parking bay where your child will be standing, so that your child basically lines up with the passenger door.
- For both drop-off and pickup, the drive through facility is not intended as a place for drivers to get out of vehicles. Children need to be independent in entering/exiting the vehicle. It is intended that parents remain in their vehicles whilst in the drive through area.

Thank you once again for your support as we work together as a community for our beautiful children.

Uniform – Winter Uniform from Monday 25th May


